In the Wake of the Tsunami: Experiences of a Police Psychologist In Sri Lanka

Michael B. Finegan, Ph.D., Lead Psychologist, Maryland State Police

On December 26, 2004, Sri Lanka's coast was devastated by a giant tsunami that killed more than 173,000 people in 11 nations. Soon thereafter, Dr. Finegan spent three weeks in the region working with survivors and other caregivers, including aid workers and community leaders. In this invited address, he will recount some of his experiences training local leaders and working directly with tsunami survivors. Dr. Finegan will give a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Safeguarding Leadership" which includes stories of what he saw and learned as he visited relief camps and destroyed villages. In addition, Dr. Finegan will discuss lessons from the tsunami disaster that may be useful to psychologists responding to the needs of caregivers and others affected by Hurricane Katrina.
