LARGE TRUCK AND BUS ENFORCEMENT

- 1 PLAN AHEAD:** CMVs need more time to stop, wider areas to park, and more distance to re-enter the roadway. Identify areas on your patrol routes where you can safely pull a CMV over.
- 2 STOP ALL VEHICLES:** Just like other vehicles, CMVs also commit moving violations and are involved in crashes. All vehicles that commit a traffic violation should be stopped, no matter the size of the vehicle.
- 3 OFFICER SAFETY:** Your safety is your top priority on the roadside. Use caution when making your initial contact with the driver. Never enter the truck without backup present.
 - 3a STAY OUT OF THE NO ZONE:** CMVs have blind spots where the driver cannot see you. If you cannot see the driver's mirrors, the driver cannot see you.
- 4 DOCUMENTS:** You only need the driver's license, registration, and proof of insurance.
- 5 CMV OFFICER:** Call a CMV officer if you suspect suspicious activity or if you notice:
 - A vehicle defect that requires further inspection,
 - Presence of drugs or alcohol, or
 - The vehicle is unsafe to the public.
