- Changes in number of police cadets
- Changes in number of runaway youth
- Changes in number of reported disciplinary issues by teachers
- Changes in number of reported disciplinary issues by parents
- Changes in number of self-reported delinquent events by youth
- Changes in number of self-reported victimizations by youth
- Changes in number of teenage pregnancies
- Changes in number of truancies/attendance records
- Changes in number of violent incidents involving youth
- Changes in number of youth arrests/citations for specific offenses
- Changes in relationships between youth and law enforcement
- Changes in relationships between youth and peers
- Changes in relationships between youth and teachers
- Changes in school environment
- Educational achievements
- Future employment/career choice



- Future involvement in juvenile justice system/criminal activity (including probation and parole)
- Future involvement in pro-social activities/programs
- Impact of various outcome measures on specific demographic groups (e.g. girls)

Note: Some outcomes could be assessed over the short term and the long-term, i.e., you could assess certain outcomes upon program completion, and then follow up on the same outcomes over time.
