AUTOMOBILE CRASH

<u>Officer Fadi Mukhlis Shukur</u> (Detroit Police Department, Michigan) was assisting other officers with crowd control outside of a club, when a **vehicle struck him** at a high rate of speed and fled the scene. A short time after the incident occurred the driver turned themselves in and was charged with vehicular homicide and an alcohol-related felony of hit-and-run.

<u>Deputy Benjamin Lemont Zirbel</u> (Clay County Sheriff's Office, Florida) succumbed to injuries sustained in a **motorcycle crash** at an intersection. He was traveling southbound when a pickup truck, towing a trailer, turned in front of him. Deputy Zirbel was unable to avoid the vehicle and collided with the trailer. He was thrown from his department's motorcycle, causing fatal injuries.

VEHICULAR ASSAULT

<u>Officer Kirk A. Griess</u> (California Highway Patrol, California) was <u>struck by a vehicle while conducting a traffic stop</u>. Officer Griess and the driver of the stopped car were both killed. The driver of the car that struck Officer Griess and the stopped car was on a cell phone at the time of the incident and was charged with a felony of gross vehicular manslaughter and reckless driving, causing fatal injuries.

DUTY RELATED ILLNESS

<u>Investigator Timothy Dale Cole Sr.</u> (Comanche County District Attorney's Office, Oklahoma) was assisting members of the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs (OBN) in serving a warrant. As agents attempted to breach the door the suspect opened fire from inside the house, striking Investigator Cole and an OBN agent. Investigator Cole suffered a spinal cord injury that rendered him a paraplegic. In later years, his health began to decline. He recently passed away due to **complications** as a result of the incident.

<u>Officer Kathleen O'Connor-Funigello</u> (New Rochelle Police Department, New York) passed away as a result of cancer that she developed following her assignment to assist with search and rescue efforts at the World Trade Center site immediately following the 9/11 Terrorist Attacks.
