GUNFIRE

<u>Investigator Farrah Turner</u> (Florence County Sheriff's Office, South Carolina) suffered **fatal gunshot wounds** when she and other investigators from the Florence County Sheriff's Office arrived at a home to interview a suspect as part of a sexual assault investigation.

<u>Sergeant Terrence Felipe Carraway</u> (Florence Police Department, South Carolina) was **shot and killed** while responding to assist three Florence County Sheriff's Office deputies, who had been shot and wounded while serving a sexual assault warrant as part of an investigation.

<u>Trooper Kevin Keith Conner</u> (North Carolina Highway Patrol, North Carolina) was **shot and killed** while conducting a traffic stop of a speeding vehicle that was reported stolen. Trooper Conner approached the stolen vehicle, when the subject opened fire, fatally wounding him.

<u>Officer Antwan DeArvis Toney</u> (Gwinett County Police Department, Georgia) was **shot and killed** as he and another officer were investigating a report of a suspicious vehicle. As Officer Toney and other officers approached the vehicle, a subject inside opened fired, fatally wounding him.

AUTOMOBILE CRASH

<u>Federal Agent Kristopher David Youngberg</u> (United States Department of Energy- National Nuclear Security Administration- Officer of Secure Transportation, U.S. Government) was killed in a **vehicle crash** when he and four other agents were returning from a training.

VEHICULAR ASSAULT

<u>Deputy Sheriff Raymond Bradley Jimmerson</u> (Nacogdoches County Sheriff's Office, Texas) was **struck and killed by a vehicle**, while responding to a report of debris in the roadway.

Duty Related Illness

<u>Sergeant Dennis W. Reichardt</u> (Suffolk County Police Department, New York) died as the **result of cancer** he developed after spending three months searching through debris at the site of the World Trade Center and the Fresh Kills landfill following the 9/11 Terrorist Attacks.

<u>Correction Officer Mark Anthony Gaspich</u> (Pennsylvania Department of Corrections, Pennsylvania) suffered a **fatal heart attack** after climbing the ladders to reach the observation platform of a guard tower at the State Correctional Institution at Camp Hill.

<u>Special Agent Dennis P. McCarthy</u> (United States Department of Homeland Security - Immigration and Customs Enforcement - Homeland Security Investigations, U.S. Government) died as the **result of cancer** due to his exposure to toxic substances following the 9/11 Terrorist Attacks at the World Trade Center in New York City, New York.

Other

Deputy Sheriff Loren Vasquez (Waller County Sheriff's Office, Texas) **drowned** while responding to reports of high water when her patrol car was swept into a water-filled ditch and overturned. After considerable effort,





other deputies were able to remove her from the vehicle, where she was transported to a local hospital and pronounced deceased.

<u>Assistant Chief Dennis Vincent</u> (Brigham City Police Department, Utah) died one week after suffering a **brain aneurysm** while participating in his annual physical fitness test.
