GUNFIRE

<u>Sergeant Ronald Lee Helus</u> (Ventura County Sheriff's Office, California) was **shot and killed** when responding to an active shooter at a local bar. He and a California Highway Patrol officer made entry into the bar to confront the shooter when Sergeant Helus was shot and severely wounded. Sergeant Helus was taken to a local hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

<u>Officer Samuel Jimenez</u> (Chicago Police Department, Illinois) was **shot and killed** while responding to a domestic disturbance at a local hospital. Officer Jimenez and other officers arrived on the scene where the subject fatally shot his ex-fiancée and led officers on pursuit into the hospital. As officers entered the hospital, the subject opened fire striking Officer Jimenez and a bystander. Officer Jimenez was transported to another hospital where he later succumbed to his wounds.

<u>Deputy U.S. Marshal Chase S. White</u> (United States Department of Justice- Marshals Service) was **shot and killed** while attempting to serve a warrant. He and other officers were attempting to arrest the subject when the individual opened fire, fatally shooting Deputy Marshal White.

AUTOMOBILE CRASH

<u>Corporal Travis Wells</u> (Dallas Police Department, North Carolina) was killed in a **vehicle crash** when his patrol car left the roadway and struck a tree, causing fatal injuries.

<u>Officer Jared William Franks</u> (Greensboro Police Department, North Carolina) was killed in a **vehicle crash** responding to a robbery in progress call, when his patrol car collided with another patrol car at an intersection and then struck a house. He was transported to a local hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

<u>Officer Toshio Hirai</u> (Gardena Police Department, California) succumbed to injuries caused by a **motorcycle crash.** Officer Hirai was on his way to the police station when his police motorcycle was struck by a vehicle. The following day he was pronounced deceased due to injuries from the crash.

<u>Officer Jason Michael Seals</u> (Slidell Police Department, Louisiana) was involved in a **motorcycle crash** while escorting a funeral procession when another vehicle pulled out in front of him causing his motorcycle and the vehicle to collide. Officer Seals was transported to a local hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

<u>Officer Leann Simpson</u> (Philadelphia Police Department, Mississippi) was killed in a **vehicle crash** while responding to assist deputies on a traffic stop.

<u>Officer Hunter Edwards</u> (Winchester Police Department, Virginia) was killed in a <u>single-vehicle crash</u> while responding to a fight call. He was transported to a local medical center where was pronounced deceased.

<u>Deputy Sheriff Antonio Hinostroza</u> (Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department, California) was killed in a **vehicle crash** while assisting other deputies who were involved in a vehicle pursuit. As Deputy Hinostroza responded to assist in the pursuit, his vehicle left the roadway and struck a utility pole. He was pronounced deceased at the scene.





VEHICULAR ASSAULT

<u>Officer David Romrell</u> (South Salt Lake Police Department, Utah) was **struck and killed by a vehicle** while responding to a burglary in progress at a local business. He and other responding offers arrived at the scene as the suspect attempted to leave. The suspect accelerated at a high rate of speed towards officers and struck Officer Romrell. Officer Romrell was transported to a local hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

Duty Related Illness

<u>Trooper Robert E. Nagle</u> (New Jersey State Police, New Jersey) died as the **result of cancer** that he developed following his assignment to the search and recovery efforts at the World Trade Center site following the 9/11 Terrorist Attacks.
