GUNFIRE

<u>Investigator Dornell Cousette</u>. (Tuscaloosa Police Department, Alabama) was shot and killed while serving a warrant. When Investigator Cousette arrived at the scene to assist, the subject opened fire, fatally wounding him. He was transported to a local hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries.

<u>Captain Vincent Liberto, Jr.</u> (Mandeville Police Department, Louisiana) was shot and killed during a vehicle pursuit. He and another officer were pursuing a vehicle, until it crashed at an intersection. One of the subjects exited the vehicle and opened fire, fatally injuring Captain Liberto.

<u>Deputy Sandeep Singh Dhaliwal</u> (Harris County Sheriff's Office, Texas) was shot and killed conducting a traffic stop. The subject inside the stopped car, exited the vehicle and ran toward Deputy Dhaliwal opening fire. Deputy Dhaliwal was flown to a local hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

Officer Brian C. Mulkeen (New York Police Department, New York) was shot and killed as a result of friendly fire. He and his team were assigned to patrol in plainclothes in a neighborhood, after a recent shooting and gang activity occurring in the area. Officers observed a suspicious person in the rear of one of the buildings and proceeded to question the subject, who then fled on foot. Officer Mulkeen pursued the subject and attempted to take him into custody, when a violent struggle ensued for control of a firearm in the individual's possession. During the struggle, the firearm discharged five times, prompting other officers on the scene to return fire. As a result, Officer Mulkeen was struck in the crossfire. He was taken to a local hospital where he succumbed to his wounds.

AUTOMOBILE CRASH

<u>Sergeant Tracy Vickers</u> (Florida Highway Patrol) was killed in a vehicle crash. His patrol car struck the rear of a truck carrying construction equipment and became trapped underneath.

DUTY RELATED ILLNESS

<u>Detective Joseph Paolillo</u> (New York Police Department, New York) died as result of cancer that he developed following his assignment to the search and recovery efforts at the World Trade Center site following the 9/11 Terrorist Attacks.

<u>Officer Derrick Bishop</u> (New York Police Department, New York) died as result of cancer that he developed following his assignment to the search and recovery efforts at the World Trade Center site following the 9/11 Terrorist Attacks.

<u>Deputy Chris Hulsey</u> (Meade County Sheriff's Office, Kentucky) suffered a fatal heart attack after struggling with a subject while executing a search warrant.
