## **GUNFIRE**

<u>Deputy Sheriff Brian Ishmael</u> (El Dorado County Sheriff's Office, California) was shot and killed while responding to a call reporting the theft of marijuana plants in the area. The operator of the marijuana grow had observed several individuals stealing from the plant. Deputy Ishamael and an off-duty deputy from San Joaquin County Sheriff's Office located the suspects and exchanged fire. Deputy Ishmael was pronounced deceased at the scene.

## **AUTO RELATED**

<u>Trooper Peter R. Stephan</u> (Florida Highway Patrol) was killed in a single-vehicle crash, while responding to assist another trooper. His patrol car left the roadway as he entered a curve and overturned before striking a utility pole. Trooper Stephan succumbed to his injuries at the scene.

<u>Deputy Sheriff Jacob Otto Allmendinger</u> (Gallatin County Sheriff's Office, Montana) was struck and killed by his patrol car. He and another deputy were responding to call of a stranded motorist, when his patrol vehicle started to slide backwards on ice. Deputy Allmendinger attempted to exit the vehicle as it continued to slide downhill and became trapped underneath.

<u>Deputy Sheriff Matthew Ryan Jones</u> (Falls County Sheriff's Office, Texas) was struck and killed by a vehicle while assisting a disable motorist on the highway. The vehicle that struck Deputy Jones, hydroplaned on the wet road and struck him and another officer

## **DUTY RELATED**

<u>Agent Robert Hotten</u> (United States Department of Homeland Security, Customs and Border Protection, U. S. Border Patrol) was found unresponsive with a head injury during a search for seven suspected undocumented individuals in the area. The department suspects he fell from a rock due to the remote and rugged nature of the area. Agent Hotten was transported to a local hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

<u>Captain Albert E. Torres</u> (Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks, California) suffered a fatal heart attack while patrolling areas affected by the Saddleridge Fire. Captain Torres had completed a 14-hour shift of patrolling parking lots and remote area in the evacuation zones in the San Fernando Valley. He collapsed onduty and was transported to a local hospital, where was pronounced deceased the following morning.

<u>Detention Officer Gene Lee</u> (Maricopa County Sheriff's Office, Arizona) succumbed to injuries sustained when he was assaulted by an inmate. The inmate grabbed him by the neck and swept his legs from below him, causing a severe head injury when his head struck the concrete floor.
