S&P Division Overview

The State & Provincial Police (S&P) Division is one of four divisions within the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). The IACP's S&P Division has the responsibility of organizing, directing, coordinating, and promoting IACP programs relating to the needs of state and provincial police agencies. The division is a membership organization comprised of the 49 state law enforcement agencies and three provincial police agencies; the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), Ontario Provincial Police, and Sureté du Québec.

The mission of the S&P Division is "To advance leadership and excellence in the delivery of quality public safety services through education, collaboration, and information sharing while adhering to the highest professional ethical standards." It is the division's goal to address key policy issues and facilitate information sharing among S&P agencies to foster collaboration and cross-jurisdictional problem solving.

2023 Impaired Driving and Traffic Safety Conference




AUGUST 9-11, 2023 | ANAHEIM, CALIFORNIA

AUGUST 16-18, 2024 | WASHINGTON, DC

The 2024 Impaired Driving and Traffic Safety Conference meeting kicked off with the Crash Awareness Reduction Effort (CARE) Section Meeting on August 15. The educational program featured 11 workshops from S&P member agencies on topics such as criminal interdiction, violent encounters, using data to reduce crashes and crime, using DREs in court, wrong-way drivers, fatal crash investigations, prosecuting DWI cases, emerging drug trends, mandatory alcohol screening, oral fluid testing, and using media for traffic safety messaging.





Navigating Campus Protests: Preparing for Fall 2024

AUGUST 21, 2024 | VIRTUAL

The IACP University/College Police Section and State & Provincial Police Division held a joint meeting to discuss lessons learned from the Spring 2024 campus protests to help state/provincial police leaders and campus police departments prepare for the Fall 2024 semester.

Over 225 people joined to hear leaders from the California Highway Patrol, Louisiana State Police, New Jersey State Police, Rutgers University, Tulane University, and the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) discuss their experiences with encampments and protests. Each representative presented their experiences from recent demonstrations with a focus on communication, coordination, and response strategies. The call also featured a briefing from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Office of Partner Engagement.

This joint effort aimed to enhance preparedness for both state/provincial police and campus police, ensure student and officer safety, and foster collaboration between S&P and university/college police agencies.




Indian Country Officer of the Year Award

Projects/Contributions

For the last two years, S&P Division members contributed to a number of projects and programs within the IACP and externally. These activities include:

IACP Policy Councils

Policy Councils are designed to facilitate communication, cooperation, and coordination among the IACP's committees and sections. Policy Councils are intended to serve as a forum for members of the IACP to collaborate on issues of importance to the law enforcement profession in a timely, focused, and flexible manner.

As of August 2024, 331 representatives of state and provincial agencies are members of the IACP Sections such as Capitol Police, Drug Recognition Expert, Human Resources, Indian Country Law Enforcement, International Managers of Police Academy & College Training, Law Enforcement Information & Technology Section, Legal Officers, Officer Safety & Organizational Wellness, Police Chaplain, Police Physicians, Police Psychological Services, Police Research Advancement, Private Sector Liaison, and Public Information Officers.

As of August 2024, 55 members of state and provincial agencies have been presidentially appointed to serve on IACP committees. These committees include Communications & Technology, Firearms, Police Investigative Operations, Forensics, Transnational Crime, Education & Training, Police Professional Standards, Ethics, and Image Committee, Arson & Explosives, Aviation, Roadway Safety, Terrorism, Vehicle Crimes, Victim Services, Crime Prevention, Narcotics & Dangerous Drugs, Homeland Security, and Criminal Justice Information System.

IACP Policy Center





Police Chief

Police Chief serves as the official publication of the IACP with a global readership of 30,000+. In 2023 and 2024, S&P members have contributed to 10 articles or columns in *Police Chief*. Topics have included gender and racial diversity, traffic enforcement, building trust, artificial intelligence, and crash investigations.

IACP Board of Directors
